The excursion begins around 8:30 in the morning when we

pick you up from your hotel or apartment to then travel the 20 kilometers on National

Route 3 that separate us from our mountain refuge in Tierra Mayor Valley. The Musher Instructor welcomes us and accompanies us on a tour through the Husky Park. With precise and appropriate explanations, he provides us with information about what we see on the premises, the why and how of the management carried out there. The history of the activity in the world and in our country, training, feeding,



care, and the peculiarities of each different dog breed are revealed during this tour. After



the tour, the Musher Instructor is ready to give us the first lessons on how to drive a dogsled. The assembly, the harnesses, the proper placement of them, the importance of the lead dog, basic commands, and how to handle the terrain according to the different types of snow. Thus, the secrets of this extraordinary activity are revealed. Once our sled is "assembled," and with the command of "Mush on!" we begin the ride. The cold wind hits our faces, the sled glides with good speed on the snow, the dogs bark, and our passengers scream with joy as the caravan of sleds ventures into the flat terrain of Tierra Mayor Valley. An old cabin, The Lumberjack's Refuge, welcomes us to enjoy a snack and have

a brief rest. It's an excellent opportunity for photos with our dogs and sled, and to admire the white landscape around us. The adventure continues as Mushers and dogs race through trails in the snowy forest, alongside frozen rivers and mountains here, at the End of the World. Back at the starting point, we dismantle our sleds, tidy up the harnesses, and bid farewell to our dogs. Finally, we say goodbye to our Musher Instructor, thanking him for the unforgettable experience, and begin our journey back to the city.
